EVENT REPORT

To commemorate the 77th Republic Day of India and observe Martyrs' Day, students of class VI organized a Special Assembly on 30th January 2025 with great solemnity, dignity, and patriotic fervour. The assembly was thoughtfully planned to honour the ideals of the Indian Constitution while paying tribute to the sacrifices of national martyrs, particularly Mahatma Gandhi. The programme was graced by the presence of the respected Principal Ma'am, Headmistress Ma'am, teachers, and students of class VI- VIII, and aimed to instill values of patriotism, unity, responsibility, and respect for the nation's legacy.

The assembly was confidently compered by two student anchors who guided the proceedings seamlessly, ensuring a smooth and disciplined flow of events. The programme began with a warm welcome to the dignitaries, followed by an introduction highlighting the significance of Republic Day and the importance of the Indian Constitution in shaping India as a sovereign, democratic republic. The observance of Martyrs' Day was also emphasized, reminding students of the supreme sacrifices made by freedom fighters for the nation's independence and unity.

As a mark of respect and gratitude, student representatives presented Republic Day badges to the Principal Ma'am and Headmistress Ma'am, symbolizing appreciation for their leadership and guidance. The gathering then sought divine blessings through a serene morning prayer, creating a calm and reflective atmosphere. This was followed by a meaningful recitation of Rabindranath Tagore's poem "*Where the Mind is Without Fear*", which inspired the audience to reflect on the ideals of freedom, fearlessness, unity, and enlightenment that align with the spirit of the Constitution. Students presented the news headlines, sharing important national, international, sports, campus and weather updates, thereby promoting awareness of current affairs and responsible citizenship. The Thought of the Day encouraged deep reflection on the values that define the nation. A moment of remembrance was observed to honour the martyrs who laid down their lives for the country, reinforcing the significance of Martyrs' Day and the ideals of peace, truth, and non-violence upheld by Mahatma Gandhi.

An engaging skit performed by the students illustrated the making and significance of the Indian Constitution. The skit, conceptualised around a time-travel narrative, effectively drew parallels between constitutional laws and the rules followed in schools and families. Curious present-day students were shown travelling back in time to the Constituent Assembly Hall, where they observed the procedure of constitution-making and law-making. Through thoughtful questioning and dialogue, the skit highlighted the rationale behind the formulation of laws and conveyed the idea of the Constitution as a

dynamic and living document, thereby helping students understand the importance of discipline, equality, harmony, and adaptability in everyday life. The assembly further highlighted the connection between national values and the school's ethos. The newly introduced school logo was showcased, reflecting the ideals of discipline, care, and responsibility. The school's vision was reinforced with the unveiling of the 2025 tagline, *"Thrive. For. Life."*, emphasizing the institution's commitment to holistic development.

The core values represented by the acronym THRIVE—Team Centric, Harmonious, Resilient, Innovative, Versatile, and Empathetic—were explained to encourage character building and ethical conduct among students. The programme was enriched by a soul-stirring patriotic song that filled the atmosphere with pride and devotion, followed by a vibrant dance performance celebrating India's rich cultural diversity. Both performances were well received and added energy and colour to the assembly. The event was further graced by the inspiring address of the Principal Ma'am, who urged students to uphold constitutional values, remember the sacrifices of national heroes, practise empathy and discipline, and strive to become responsible and conscientious citizens. The assembly concluded on a reflective and patriotic note with a vote of thanks to the Principal Ma'am and all contributors. The students reaffirmed the school's vision with the message, *"Don't just survive. Thrive. For life."*, followed by a respectful and resounding chorus of *"Jai Hind! Jai Bharat!"* The assembly proved to be a meaningful and enriching experience, successfully blending patriotism, constitutional awareness, remembrance of martyrs, and school values, leaving students inspired and motivated.
